

Anglingsites in Odder

The coast line in the Odder region is not only incredible beautiful but also a very good fishing ground.

You will find sea trout along most of the coast and in the spring there are also shoals of garfish that use the area as spawning ground. It is fascinating to watch this ballet dancer of the seas as you see it leaping over the surface of the water.

While enjoying the landscape and the pleasure of fishing, you will have the chance of catching a flatfish or maybe a cod or an eel. More difficult is it to lure the mullet but when it bites, you will feel the enormous strength of this fish with an average weight of 3-6 kilos. This is truly unforgettable but there are many other fishing experiences waiting for you, so get out your fishing rod!

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Information

Everyone aged between 18 and 67 angling in Denmark must hold a valid angling licence. Angling is fishing using light hand tackle. Fishing in trout lakes (called "put and take"), does not normally require an angling licence, but a pass which can be purchased on site. Your angling licence is personal, and you must carry your receipt for payment while fishing, together with personal identification. In fresh water, the owner of the fishing water must give permission to fish.

1. The beach at Sondrup

Fiskearter: Sea trout and garfish during the season.

Parking: Big parking area.

Tip: Fish to the right of the stairs, excellent during the winter and early spring.

Vigtigt: The use of waders is frequently required.

2. Alrø, at Løkken (the south-west tip of Alrø)

Fish Species: Sea trout, steelhead, and garfish during the season.

Parking: Excellent spacious car park with toilet facilities.

Tips: Cast across the mussel bed stretching west from Egehoved, approx. 10-minute walk to the right. Visible when the tide is low. Perfect for fly-fishing.

Important! Use of waders required. Deep channel with strong currents. Exercise great caution! Fish to the right of the gravel

3. Alrø, near the dam.

Fish Species: Sea trout, steelhead, and garfish during the season.

Parking: Beside the dam there is a parking area.

Tips: Excellent family site on the east side of the dam for fishing for garfish. Ideal conditions at high tide and weak westerly winds. Bubble float with herring as bait. Sea trout and steelhead in deep channels between Alrø and the beach at Lerdrup. Use of waders required. Excellent waters for fly-fishing or using a bubble float with herring as bait.

Important! Channels with depths of up to 3 metres and strong currents. Exercise great caution!

4. Gyllingnæs

Fish Species: Sea trout and garfish during the season; grey mullet summer and autumn; eel and flounder when the wind is in the east.

Parking: The beach at Lerdrup (shallow) on the west side of the headland. At the beach, it is approx. 4 km on foot along the beach.

Tips: The use of waders is required. Anglers are advised to look over the location first at low water in order to spot the offshore bar and various other sites.

This site is well worth a visit with or without your fishing gear.

5. Horskær

Fish Species: Sea trout and garfish during the season; grey mullet summer and autumn.

Parking: On the verge immediately before the gravel road ? distance to the water is 200 to 300 metres.

Tips: Fish to the right of the gravel road and all the way out to the bar. Grey mullet-fishing in the bay between the bar and Gyllingnæs, particularly around the island. The entire area is very low-lying, requiring the use of waders. Eel and flounder particularly when the wind is in the east.

Important! The area is "out of season" during the period of 1 March to 1 August.

6. Hou

Fish Species: Sea trout, steelhead, cod, flounder and garfish during the season.

Parking: Harbour area. Excellent facilities: toilet, kiosk, etc.

Tips: Sea trout throughout the entire area. Excellent fishing using a bubble float with herring as bait for catching garfish from the outer jetty. In the shallow waters south of the harbour, you may chance upon enormous shoals of garfish.

Perfect spot for fly-fishing these sly long-billed fish. Cod-fishing in the docks or from the outer jetty. Best at dusk. Flounder-fishing with the wind in the east, from the outer side of the north jetty. Best when sunset and high tide coincide.

7. The beach at Hølken

Fish Species: Sea trout and garfish during the season, and flounder.

Parking: Large grassy area. Day-camping allowed.

Tips: Sea trout-fishing just off the grassy area and right to the camp site.

Flounder-fishing when the wind is in the east, best at high tide and at sunset for a larger catch. Fine opportunities for a secondary catch of eel and cod. Fish approx. 100 to 500m to the right, use a heavy surf tackle in the surf to improve your catch.

Important! The use of waders is required for spin-fishing during summer to stay untangled from the eelgrass. Every year, there are catches of turbot of up to 5 kg using nets along the stretch between Hølken and Kysingnæs; could be well worth a try!

8. Dyngby Hage

Fish species: Sea trout and garfish during the season, flounder and cod.

Parking: The entire area is a summer house area where parking, unfortunately, is not allowed. It is, however, possible to park right outside the area and then walk down to the water.

Tips: Large beds of pebbles and mussels, great inshore channel to the right of the bar where you will often find fish. Flounder-fishing when the wind is in the east, best at high tide and at sunset for a larger catch. Fine opportunities for a secondary catch of eel and cod.

Important: The use of waders is rarely required.

Every year, there are catches of turbot up to 5kg using nets along the stretch between Hølken and Kysingnæs could be well worth a try!

9. The bay of Saksild

Fish Species: Dab and flounder; with a good chance of sea trout and garfish during the season.

Tips: Very popular bathing beach with many visitors. Every year, there are catches of turbot of up to 5 kg using nets along the stretch between Hølken and Kysingnæs; could be well worth a try!

10. The beach at Kysing

Fish species: Sea trout and garfish during the season; flounder, cod, with a good chance of eel.

Parking: Large excellent car park with tables, benches and toilet facilities.

Tips: Sea trout-fishing throughout the entire area, flounderfishing from the concrete blocks on the beach to the right of the car park. Flounder-fishing when the wind is in the east, best at high tide - and at sunset for a larger catch. Fine opportunities for a secondary catch of eel and cod. There have been catches of flounder of up to 46cm!!

Important: The use of waders is frequently required.

11. Kysingnæs

Fish species: Sea trout and garfish during the season, a good chance for cod.

Parking: The Norsminde Harbour; follow the beach south towards the headland.

Tips: Fish on the right hand side of the headland. Perfect site for flyfishing, or bubble float with a fly as bait. This site is very small and frequented by many anglers. During the season, you have to be an early bird to get a free spot. Small spoons recommended.

Important: The use of waders is required, but is also very difficult. Stick for depth-measuring recommended.

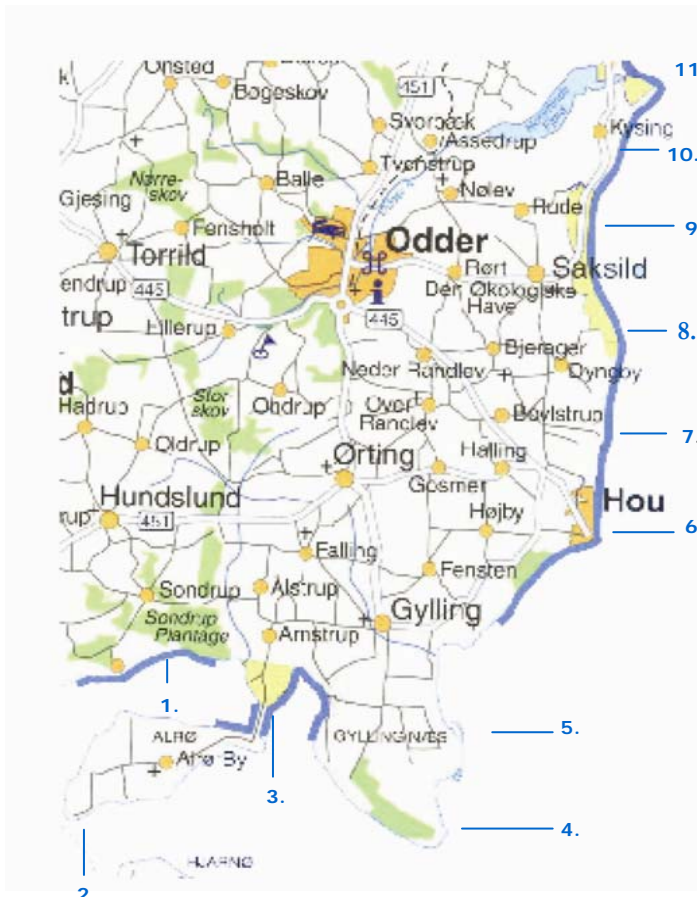
12 og 13. Tunø

Tunø is a paradise for anglers who wish to fish from shore.

Fish species: Sea trout and garfish during the season, flounder, cod and a good chance of eelpout. In addition to the above species, you can chance upon huge shoals of grey mullet in these waters, with excellent opportunities of fishing exclusively for this muscular fellow.

Parking: As cars are not allowed on the island, the angling sites are only reachable on bicycle or on foot.

Tips: Of particular interest are Stenkalven on the north coast where the rocks lure the sea trout close to the coast, and the Sønderklint with its steep slopes which provide for the angler both shelter and trout. Furthermore, you can see migratory shoals of the grey mullet from the sand hills. The island is rather small, making it easy to try the fishing in all of the waters. The harbour is also a guaranteed site for grey mullet-fishing. There are also frequent stocks of small cod and pollack in the harbour.
